Why it's a good idea to limit liquor licenses in our neighborhood

Drinking and shooting unfortunately go hand-in-hand



Researchers have long demonstrated that more shootings take place near bars and liquor stores than any other place. Now there's more disturbing news. A recent study published in the *British Medical Journal* shows that gun owners are also bigger drinkers. This means that people that already own guns are more likely to frequent bars and places where liquor is sold than people who do not own guns. The more liquor licenses in a neighborhood—the more gun owners it attacks.

Recent tragedy at Salas Groceries

There's hardly a nicer family in the Park Neighborhoods than the Salas clan. They own the Salas Grocery store at the corner of 9th and Hayes—a store than only a year ago received a liquor license. On August 7 two men walked into the store and ran off with two 24-packs of Corona. A Salas cousin, just 18-years old, decided to pursue the men in his car. Unfortunately, the thieves also had at least one gun in their car and shot the young man. He died from his wounds.
